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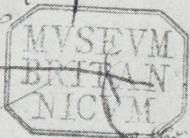

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INTRODUCTORY NOTE

The editorial practice in this volume follows that of previous volumes, with two exceptions. In the lists of land grants (pp. 139-155) and of the Stafford fees (pp. 232-4) only the headings are translated, and the Household assignments on pp. 155-163 are selectively translated. This change in practice is due to the repetitiveness of the entries; all other Latin passages are translated in full. Secondly, in the lists of office holders in this volume paragraph marks have been retained where they are used to draw attention to specific entries, and are indicated by [n]. Elsewhere in the manuscript they are used indiscriminately, and have been omitted.

As in Volume Two, a number of scribal omissions have been supplied from other sources, as follows:-
